Comment: I wish to make the following objections to the proposals made by Exeter college.

1) The height of the new building is disproportionate to the current building. This will have a detrimental effect on the overall Jericho Conservation area. Recent developments in this area have been in keeping with the height and general character of the neighbourhood.

2) Loss of privacy to students at the neighbouring Worcester College. The height of the building will mean that privacy in buildings in neighbouring student accommodation will lack privacy. Furthermore, there is currently space between the current buildings and the neighbouring student accommodation. The plans in their current form take this away meaning the accommodation will increase the density of the area.

3) Loss of amenity in the historic orchard which is used by thousands of students and visitors every year. One important amenity which will be lost is the view towards the observatory which is currently visible. Furthermore the height of the building will increase the shadows over the Grade 1 listed remains of Gloucester College and the orchard.

4) There may also be an increase of noise in the area during termtime which would be unacceptable as there will be 90 students in resident at any one time.

For these reasons the council should reject the proposals in their current form.
