Comment:Speaking as a long-term Oxford resident, I'm dismayed and alarmed to note that the proposed development clearly damages the visual context in which the east aspect of Worcester College stands, and compromises its stylistic integrity. This highly-integrated context includes not only the College but also part of lower Walton Street, Beaumont Street and the Ashmolean Museum. While Oxford is rich in architectural treasures, we do not have much else from precisely this period and of this integrated character. The use of stone from near Bath in this context makes oblique reference to the building of the nearby canal. I believe there is an argument for applying a similar caution here as do the City of Bath regarding the choice of

building material. Other the new buildings in the area appear to have applied similar caution.

It is hard to see how the proposed, rather bulky-looking building cannot damage the current Georgian character of lower Walton Street and the adjoining streets, consistent with the OUP building and the building occupied by Freud cafe.

As an Oxford resident, I make frequent use of the College gardens, and I'm most disappointed that the view from the College gardens towards the north-west will be disrupted and it's character lost.
